- 2. Avoid Inappropriate Clothing: Do not wear shorts, skirts, or revealing attire.
- 3. Do Not Touch the Idol: Refrain from touching the deity or sacred objects.
- 4. No Alcohol/Tobacco: Alcohol, tobacco, and intoxicants are strictly banned on temple premises.
